- Target small to medium size nonprofits with revenue between \$300,000 and \$7M who operate in Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Washington, Waukesha counties.
- Projects/programs that are transformative, impactful, sustainable
- Apply in 5 focus areas: Health, Environment, Arts & Culture, Education, and Family
- Over 100 members review 60-80 grants annually
