Stacy Scheffer: Going All In

In 2017, Stacy was having coffee with her mentor, Karin Gale, and was surprised how enthusiastic she was about an upcoming non-profit event. Karin insisted, "you have to come to our annual event." Stacy went and was instantly hooked. She joined Impact100 that night and self-nominated to be on the board her first year.

"I was drawn to the organization because of the intentional funding to our community's nonprofits. I was blown away by the level of due diligence in disbursing funds and selecting the finalists," Stacy says. It is important to Stacy that her donation have a larger impact than giving \$100 or \$500 to an organization. She loved that her donation would be part of a grant that would fund dream projects for these organizations. Stacy served on a grant committee three of her first four years as a member and found it truly rewarding.

In her day job, Stacy is a Finance Manager at Charter Manufacturing. When she self-nominated, she knew she wanted to flex her creative side with Impact100 instead of staying in accounting. She joined the board as the Membership Director and has never looked back! She loves getting to meet members, understand why members join and why they stay. whose lives have been profoundly affected by trauma and tragic experiences, like addiction or abuse. Hope Street utilized their \$100K Impact grant to complete funding of the construction costs and materials, furnishings, equipment and supplies for two classrooms and a resource center within the new Shechem Community Center. Adjacent to Hope Street's apartment building, the center will provide after-school programming for students grades 1-12 from the 10 schools located within one mile of Hope Street. Additionally, the spaces will be used in offhours for adult classes and workshops and be open to organizations in the nearby neighborhood.

We asked Stacy what her top three things she'd like members to do?

"Every first or second year have members join a grant committee. This is the best way to understand our model, meet amazing women in the organization, and learn about our community's nonprofits. Join to listen and learn—you will not be disappointed," she assures.

"Take 10 minutes and ask people in your network to attend our events. Come to the kickoff event on September 13 with two or three friends. My guests have never thought it was a waste of time. Your guest might know a nonprofit that could apply for a grant, connect us to a sponsor or even join," Stacy says.

"Raise your hand to help. I made long-lasting friendships, met mentors and built strong community connections through Impact100.
